**3. Excursion to the Imperial War Museum North, Manchester
Sunday, 30th October 2005**

ICOM proposes a one-day-excursion to Manchester on Sunday, October 30th 2005 to interested participants of the conference. The aim of this excursion is to visit the new and interesting *Imperial War Museum North*.

Opened at The Quays in Trafford Park, Manchester in July 2002, IWM North focuses on how war shapes lives. The museum was designed by world-renowned architect Daniel Libeskind (for further information see: <http://north.iwm.org.uk/>). A guided tour through the exhibition and a discussion with members of the staff will be part of the excursion.

The excursion will start from London Euston on Sunday, October 30th 2005 (departure early in the morning). The train London – Manchester takes about 3 hours. Return to London Sunday afternoon.

Participants are required to book the train by themselves and take care of all travel arrangements. Everyone is free to spend more time in Manchester. ICOM can not cover any travel expenses.
